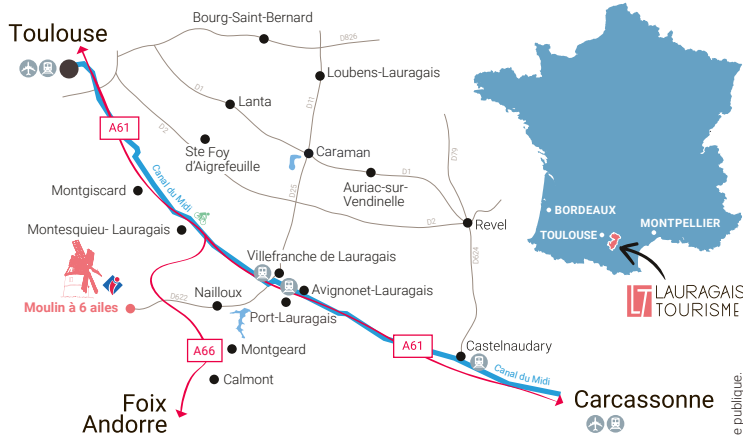

**Guided tour of the mill with bread workshop**  
Monday to Friday at 10:30 during all school holidays  
(French C zone).

The six-winged windmill opens its doors during school holidays for an original and fun visit. Young and old roll up their sleeves to shape their own bread and customize it!

During cooking, the guide will show you the history of the Lauragais and its cereal crops, its hilly landscapes and this curious six-winged red mill that attracts all eyes. It faces the majestic mountains of the Pyrenees that can be admired from the foot of the mill.

After having climbed the top of the latter, near the millstones and wings, you pick up your bread to take home or enjoy it hot at the end of the visit!

## Witness to ancestral know-how

The different parts of the mechanism (large wheel, wings...) were made with various wood species with multiple properties (compression, bending, shearing...).



The "rotating" wheel on top is made of Sidobre granite, while the "dormant" wheel in the wood formwork is made of flint.

Both come from an old mill located in Montgeard.

Formerly located in the heart of the village of Nailloux, the old mill already surprised by its particular number of wings : six !

Unfortunately destroyed at the beginning of the 20th century, there are no remains. You can see in the photo the miller standing proudly in front of his strange mill!
